

Safeguarding at Warden Hill Infant School

Staff and Governors at Warden Hill Infant School are aware that many children are the victims of different kinds of abuse and that they can be subjected to social factors that have an adverse impact upon their lives, including domestic violence, substance misuse, bullying, mental health and radicalisation. We also acknowledge that safeguarding incidents could happen anywhere and staff are alert to possible concerns arising.


Through our curriculum we teach children to stay safe and happy. We encourage the understanding that any problem or worry that they may have is legitimate, and to share their worries, big or small with their trusted adult, at home, school or with ChildLine.

Personal Responsibility and Liberty

- Understanding own responsibility in school in terms of behaviour and learning attitudes – values curriculum
- Pupil's role within the school community – becoming the best people they can possibly be.

Anti-Bullying

Keeping safe from bullying is an integral part of our PSHE curriculum. Through our Values-based curriculum pupils learn how to behave towards each other promoting the British values of tolerance and mutual respect.

Pupils told us that bullying is does not often happen, children spoke confidently about different types of bullying and what to do if they were being bullied. Children were able to distinguish between ad hoc name calling and persistent bullying as a result of our teaching and approach to bullying.
